Adding a new registry to the phonebook

Press <OK> to access the phonebook.
Press and to select PHONEBOOK
Press to select ADD.
Press <OK> to input the name.
Press <OK> to input the number.
Press <OK> and to scroll and select the ringer type desired.
Press <OK> to store the information in phonebook.

Verifying a phonebook registry

Press <OK> to access the phonebook.
Press to select the desired registry.
Press and to select LOOK.
Press <OK> and to scroll and verify the name, number and ringer stored in the phonebook.

Verifying a phonebook registry

Press <OK> to access the phonebook.
Press to select the desired registry.
Press and to select EDIT.
Press <OK>. The selected phonebook entry will be displayed.
Edit the name if necessary and press <OK>.
Edit the number if necessary and press <OK>.
Select the ringer and press <OK> to confirm.

Deleting a phonebook registry

Press <OK> to access the phonebook.
Press to select the desired registry.
Press and to select DELETE.
Press <OK> to confirm.

- Use only the telephone line and power adapter provided with your telephone.

6. Installation

Connecting the base station (see Fig. 4 in page 4)

- Plug the power supply and line cord into the base station.
- Plug the power adapter into an electrical wall outlet and the telephone line cord into your telephone line socket.

WARNING:

Use only the provided adaptor, using other power supplies may cause a hazard or damage the phone.
Install the base unit in a position where the mains adapter plug will reach an easily accessible mains socket to unplug in case needed. Never try to lengthen the mains power cable.

NOTE:

The base unit needs power for normal operation, it is not just for charging the handset batteries.

Installing and charging the batteries (see Fig. 5 in page 4)

- Place the two batteries, included with your telephone, inside the battery compartment making sure the correct polarity is properly aligned.
- Place the battery compartment cover in place and slide upwards until it snaps in closed position.
- Place the handset in the base and charge for at least 15 hours before using your telephone for the first time.
→ The handset will make a short sound when it correctly placed in a telephone base or charging base.

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Setting the dialing mode between PULSE/TONE

Press and to select CONFIG BASE.
Press <OK> and to select DIALING MODE.
Press <OK> and to select between PULSE or TONE.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Setting the flash time

Press and to select CONFIG BASE.
Press <OK> and to select FLASH TIME.
Press <OK> and to select flash time between short (100ms), medium (270ms), long (600ms).
Press <OK> to confirm.

Changing PIN code

The access password (PIN) is a secret 4 number code which serves as security to accessing the base and handset programming. The default PIN number is 0000.
Press and to select CONFIG BASE.
Press <OK> and to select CHANGE PIN.
Press <OK> and you will be asked to enter the PIN number.
Enter the current PIN number.
Press <OK> and enter the desired new PIN number.
Press <OK> and enter again the same PIN number for verification.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Removing a handset registration

Press and to select CONFIG BASE.
Press <OK> and to select DELETE HANDSET.
Press <OK> and you will be asked to enter the PIN number.
Enter the configured PIN number.
Press <OK> and the list of handsets will be displayed.
Press to select the handset from the list.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Paging the handsets

If you cannot find a handset or has been misplaced, you can make the handsets ring by pressing the PAGE key in the base. All the handsets will ring at once. You can turn off the ring by pressing on any of the handsets.

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7. Telephone operation

Making a call

Predialling to make a call

- Enter the phone number and press or to connect to the line and dial the number.
→ When entering the number, if you make a mistake, press C/⊗ to delete digits.

Direct dialing

- Press or to connect to the line and then enter the phone number.

Calling from the phonebook

- Press , , OK to enter the phonebook, then press or to select a number.
- Press or to make the call to the selected number.

Calling from the call list

- Press to enter the call list and then press or to select a number from the call list.
- Press or to make the call to the selected number.

Calling from the redial list

- Press to enter the redial list and then press or to select a number from the redial list.
- Press or to make the call to the selected number.

Call timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of every call. The call timer is displayed as soon as you answer a call or 15 seconds after dialing and remains on the screen for 5 seconds after the end of the call. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

Answering a call

If the handset is not in its charging base:

- Press or to answer a call when there is an incoming call.

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Alarm set up

This telephone can be used as an alarm clock. When the alarm is activated, will be shown in the display. When the set time is reached the display will show ALARM ON flashing and handset will ring for 45 seconds. Press any keys of the handset to turn off the alarm. If the REPEAT ALARM function (snooze) is activated, the Handset will ring again in 7 minutes. To turn this off you must press and hold .

Activating the alarm

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select CONFIG ALARM.
Press <OK> and to select between ON / OFF.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Configuring the alarm time

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select ALARM.
Press <OK> and to select between ON / OFF.
Press <OK> to confirm.
Enter the hour/minutes desired.
Press <OK> to configure the REPEAT ALARM (snooze) function.
Press <OK> and to select ON / OFF.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Selecting ringer tone

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select RINGER CONFIG.
Press <OK> and to select between EXTERNAL RING.
Press <OK> and to select the desired ringer. (5 polyphonic / 5 standard)
Press <OK> to confirm.

Adjusting ringer volume

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select RINGER CONFIG.
Press <OK> and to select between RING VOLUME.
Press <OK> and to select the desired volume. A total of 6 options are available including VOLUME OFF.
If VOLUME OFF is selected the icon will be displayed.
Press <OK> to confirm.

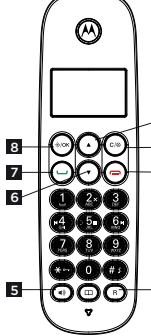

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NOTE:

If AUTO ANSWER is activated, then lifting the handset off the base or charger will answer the call automatically and no keys need to be pressed.

Ending a call

- During a call, press to hang up and end the call, or
- Place the handset on the base cradle and the call will be ended.

Adjusting the volume

There are 5 levels, VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 5, to choose from for each of the earpiece and speaker volumes.

During a call:

- Press to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown.
→ When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

Turning off the handset ringer

In idle, press and hold # to turn off the handset ringer. The icon is displayed on the LCD.

NOTE:

The display will still flash the call icon and show CALL or the caller display number, when there is an incoming call, even if the ringer is turned off. To turn the ringer back on, press and hold # again.

Activating the keypad lock

You can lock the keypad so that it cannot be used accidentally while carrying it around.

- In idle, press and hold * to turn on the keypad lock and the icon will show up in the display.

NOTE:

You can still use to answer a call when the handset is ringing.

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Key tone configuration

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select TONE CONFIG.
Press <OK> and to select KEY TONE.
Press <OK> and to turn ON and OFF this function.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Language configuration

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select LANGUAGE.
Press <OK> and to select the desired language.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Personalizing (naming) a handset

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select RENAME HANDSET.
Press <OK> and input the desire name/word.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Auto answering configuration

With auto answering active, an incoming call will be answered once the handset is taken out of the charging base without pressing any buttons.
Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select AUTO ANSWER.
Press <OK> and to ON / Off this function.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Date format

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select DATE AND TIME.
Press <OK> and to select FORMAT DATE.
Press <OK> and to select the desired format (DD-MM-YY or MM-DD-YY).
Press <OK> to confirm.

Time format

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select DATE AND TIME.
Press <OK> and to select FORMAT TIME.
Press to select the format from 12HRS or 24HRS.
Press <OK> and to confirm.

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Redialling the last number

You can redial any of the 5 last numbers called. If you have stored a name in phonebook to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recent last number will display at the top of the redial list.

Redialling a number from the redial list

- In idle mode, press to access the redial list.

NOTE:

If the redial list entry shows a name, press # to view the number of this entry.

- Press to browse the redial list.
- Press or to dial to the selected redial number.

NOTE:

If there are no numbers in the redial list, the display shows EMPTY .

Finding a handset

You can locate the handset by pressing the find key . All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone and show PAGING on the display for 60 seconds.

You can stop the paging by pressing on any handset or on the base again.

NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

8. Private phonebook

Each handset can store up to 20 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. (Note that the different ringtones only play when you receive a call if you subscribe to caller display and the incoming number matches the stored number.) Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

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Setting up the time

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select DATE AND TIME.
Press <OK> and to select CONFIG TIME.
Press <OK> to input information of the time.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Setting up the date

Press and to select CONFIG HANDSET.
Press <OK> and to select DATE AND TIME.
Press <OK> and to select CONFIG DATE.
Press <OK> to input information of the date.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Returning to default settings

Doing this will reset your system to factory settings and all data will be lost.

Press and to select DEFAULT.
Press <OK> and you will be asked to enter the PIN number.
Key in your PIN number (4 digits).
Press <OK> to accept.
Press <OK> to confirm.

Registering handset to the base:

- Press and hold on the base station for more than five seconds, to put the base station into registration mode. It will stay in registration mode for about 1 minute, so the following handset sequence must be completed within this time.
- Press and to select REGISTRATION
- Press OK to display PIN?.....
- Enter the 4-digit system PIN (default 0000).
- Press OK to confirm, and the display will show SEARCHING. If the handset registration is successful, you will hear a confirmation tone and the will stop flashing.

The handset will automatically be allocated the next available handset number. This handset number is shown in the handset display in standby mode. If the handset registration is unsuccessful, the will still flash.

Listening to new stored messages

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **PLAY MESSAGE**.
Press **<OK>** to start playing the messages. The handset will display the date and time information of when the message was recorded.

Note
The icon **★** will show up in the handset display when a new message is being played.

Press **⏮** to select **STOP, FORWARD, REWIND, OFF** to perform these functions.

STOP: Stops the message when being played and returns to the answering machine menu.
FORWARD: Plays the next message. The date and time will be shown in the handset display.

REWIND: Returns to the beginning of the message. The date and time will be shown in the handset display.

OFF: Ends the current playing message and the next available message will start playing.

Note
As an alternate method, you can follow the functions belows when playing and managing your messages.
Press the key **<5>** to stop playing message.
Press the key **<4>** to play the message from the begining.
Press the key **<4>** twice to return to the previous message.
Press the key **<6>** to play the next available message.
Press the key **<2>** to end the current playing message.
Press **<OK>** to confirm.

Recoding a Memo

You can record a memo in your answering machine so other persons that use the phone can listen to it. The memo is accessed the same way as listening to stored message. You can record a memo any time no matter if the answering machine is in off or on mode.

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **MEMO**.
Press **<OK>** to start recording memo. The display will show **RECORDING**.
Press **<OK>** to stop the recording.
The memo recorded will then play and will be saved in memory.
Press **<C>** to stop the playback without saving the memo and returns to the menu.

Configuring the answering machine

You will need to use your handset to configure your answering machine using the menu **ANS MACHINE**.

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS SETTINGS**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS MODE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS/REC** or **ANS ONLY**.
Press **<OK>** to confirm.

Recording your own outgoing message (OGM)

You can record your own outgoing message for **ANS/REC** or **ANS ONLY** modes. After you record you message, it will be used when the answering machine answers a call coming in. If you deactivate your personal OGM, then the answering machine will use the factory set recording of your system which is in English.

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **OUTGOING MSG**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS & RECORD** or **ANS ONLY**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **PLAY MESSAGE**.
Press **<OK>** to start recording your personal outgoing message. The screen will show **RECORDING**.
Press **<OK>** to save. Your personal message will be replayed automatically after you finish your recording.
Also, you can press ***** to return to the previous screen without saving the personal message.

Setting the amount of ringers for answering machine to answer
You can set the amount of ringers of when you want your answering machine answers an incoming call.

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANSWER DELAY**, available options:
2 rings, 4 rings, 6 rings, 8 rings or none.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select the number of rings wanted.
Press **<OK>** to confirm.

Setting maximum recording time per message

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **RECORD TIME**, options available:
60S, 120S, 180S, or unlimited.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select the recording maximum time wanted.
Press **<OK>** to confirm.

Monitoring the message that is being recorded

When the answering machine is activated and someone is leaving a message, the base automatically enters into monitoring call mode (you will hear the message that is being recorded). You can also monitor the call that is being recorded, without picking up call and through the handset.

Activating/Deactivating your answering machine

You can activate or deactivate your answering machine using your handset so calls can be picked up and messages can be stored in your machine.
Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **TAM SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ANS □ REC**.
Press **<OK>** and **↵** to select **TAM ON/OFF**.
Press **<OK>** to confirm.

Monitoring a message through your handset

When a message is being left in the answering machine, on the screen of the handset it's going to show the word **MONITOR**. Press **⓪OK>** to listen to the message that is being recorded, without picking up the call. At any time, you may answer the call by pressing any key on the handset and the recording will be interrupted automatically.

Changing the recording compression ratio

Increasing the compression ratio will permit you save more messages in your system, but they will have a lower audio quality.
You can select up to three compression ratios for messages that will be attended by the answering machine (high, medium, low).
Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **TAM SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **COMPRESSION**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select between high, medium and low.
Press **<OK>** to confirm selection.

Activating the remote access

When you are out, you can remotely access your answering machine to listen and manage your messages. To be able to have remote access, you must first make sure you know your security PIN for your answering system. It is recommended for you to assign your own personal PIN to prevent access from unauthorized persons.

Changing your answering machine security PIN

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **TAM SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **MODIFY PIN**.
Press **<OK>** to enter actual PIN. (default PIN is 0000)
Press **<OK>** to enter new PIN.
Press **<OK>** to enter again the new PIN.

Activating or disactivating remote access

Press **⏮** and **↶** to select **ANS MACHINE**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **TAM SETTING**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **REMOTE ACC**.
Press **<OK>** and **↶** to select **ON/OFF** to permit the remote access.
Press **<OK>** to confirm.

Accessing remotely your answering machine

When your answering machine answers the remote call, press **< * >** if you want to access the remote mode of your answering machine.

Note 1

Follow the proper process to operate this answering machine model. Enter your security PIN of your answering system.

Note 2

If you enter the PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the call will be hung up automatically.
